## October-December 2002

There have been a number of investigations of sheep and cattle losses (up to 15% of mob) in groups of animals following the sudden introduction of **ad lib** soyabean meal. Clinical signs were such as ataxia, convulsions, high stepping, star gazing and recumbency. Acute ammonia toxicity appeared the most likely cause as soybean meal is rapidly fermented in the rumen. These incidents indicate that offering two to four days intake of Soyabean meal at one feeding is hazardous. To date no problems have been reported where the feeding method restricts the soyabean meal intake by mixing with other supplements

This order was passed on to World Wide Genetics. The rest of the export orders were for Anglo Nubians and Saanens. Only one order was for commercial Saanens and that export order had to be from a blue tongue free area so it was passed on to South Australia.

Not all enquiries resulted in orders. But we did get a few sales in each state. I hope you all had a good kidding season with lots of lovely Does born. Our thoughts and prayers are with those of you in the bushfire areas, we hope that you and your animals are safe at this very trying time.

Please let me know if you have animals for export and I will pass your details on to the export agents Exports going out of Victoria

### **Milk Awards:**

List of milk awards pertinent to Dairy Doe competition forwarded by K Hopkins.

I have not received any new applications for milk testing. Since my last report I have processed 13 awards for 24hr tests. Congratulations to the breeders who are milk testing their does.

I have attached the complete list of awards that I have processed since holding the SMAO position in July. There would have been more awards processed in the first half of the year, but I am waiting for Noelene to send me this list. I will forward it on when I receive it, it should be in the next few days. In the mean time, the attached list should give you a start for the Dairy Doe points.

I have a proposal for the committee to consider for the 2016 show season, in regards to Type & Production Herd Recording class:

To enter the T&P HR class does must have; a Milk Award Certificate for an R, RS, RM, or AR award, or the F equivalent, OR a current herd recording production report that shows production figures for the current lactation if still in progress.

This variation to the rule will allow exhibitors to show their herd recorded does during their lactation. This is particularly beneficial to does on their first lactation. The production points would still be calculated the same. I think this variation to the rule will increase the numbers of entries in the T&P HR class. I understand that a rule similar to this has been operational in NSW with great success

[this proposal was discussed in the correspondence - any changes to rules have to go to a general meeting of members and be voted on.]

## Vaccinations

Autumn in Australia is the time to vaccinate your pregnant does so their colostrum will have plenty of antibodies to protect their kids. Vaccinate in the last 4-6 weeks of pregnancy. You have to juggle this with their CAE testing as goats should not be tested within 1 month of kidding nor within 1 month of getting vaccinated. Many vaccinate as they are caught for their annual herd test for CAE.

Vaccine have adjuvants added to the. Basically adjuvants make the body take notice of the vaccine and not ignore them. Particularly in goats, they can cause what some people have called a “sterile Abscess”. If lanced there is no bacteria grown from any sample. Basically it is an overreaction by the body to the adjuvant and not something to worry about. Of course it is still possible to use incorrect injection techniques or vaccine that has been contaminated – in which case the vaccine may not have worked. If you used a sterile needle, a new vaccine bottle and wiped the skin first then it is most likely a reaction to the adjuvant. I do it in the loose skin behind the shoulder so the lump is hidden for show goats – see my video on how to vaccinate a goat -

Meat goats should be vaccinated under the ear so there is no carcass damage. Meat goats are generally vaccinated with a vaccinating gun to save time as numbers are higher and time generally prevent using a sterile syringe and needle. However needles should be rotated frequently and antiseptic used as much as possible. If there is any possibility of CAE being present in a goat herd then a new needle **MUST** be used for each goat.

Do you read the insert in your Vaccine box?

I find many goat breeders don't read the inserted instructions and as a result are not vaccinating their goats every 6 months ( as a minimum ). Rather than read instructions they rely on overseas website advice, which in the USA recommends annual vaccinations. Goats in Australia need to be vaccinated for enterotoxaemia at least every six months and more often if getting high amounts of grain or lush pasture.

## From Qld to Russia

Three generations of the one family - and their goats – travelled to Rockhampton from stud properties west of Charters Towers this week to keep up their show time tradition

Kate Thomson achieved her dream of owning a goat 40 years ago, and her daughter Jen Brodie started her own goat stud at the age of 13. Now Jen's five year old son Torino has one of his own too – with help from his dad.

They show their goats from north at Charters Towers to down south at the EKKA. Kate originally got into goats so they could use them for their milk, but she also trades on the live export market to places as far as afield as Russia, the Middle East and Asia to improve the dairy herds for those countries.

I recently received a phone call about a lady who recently lost her much loved doe kid as neither she nor her vet knew how to treat barber pole worm properly. I was asked to write up some information on worms so she and other people, and their goats, may hopefully benefit from it and, even though I am qualified to do this, have read many books containing relevant information, have an Associate Diploma in Applied Science (Rural), and have had personal experience with barber pole and other worms, I am going to include some very good information written by other more qualified people and copied from *Diseases of Livestock, Eighth Edition, T.G. Hungerford, B.V.Sc., F.A.C.V.Sc., H.D.A. Published 1975.*

The information from this book is as relevant today as it was in 1963. Worms affect our goats the same way now as they did when this book was written, but many worms now have a resistance to the then currently used drenches, mainly from under-dosing by not knowing each animal's correct weight and using the sheep dose instead of increasing it for each individual animal's own weight. Please contact your vet for newer, current anthelmintics and the dose rate for goats.

I lost a few goats to worms in my early goat keeping days (from 1971) before I learnt about the different types of worms and how to treat them. Mainly it was to barber pole worm, but I read everything I could and had a good vet who was willing to help and we found the following worked well for my situation at the time.

The worm life cycle varies with each variety, but if you worm every three weeks you can usually keep them all under control. One important factor in worm control is the weather; in VERY wet and warm to hot you may need to worm every week to control barber pole worm, in winter, if cold and dry, you can worm three weekly or a little longer. Barber pole worm is the biggest goat killer and the easiest to recognise if your animal has them. They do not scour with this worm and the first sign is usually pale pink or white gums and lower eyelids followed by swelling around and under the jaw. At this stage a goat is in big trouble and near death. My vet worked out a program for me to follow which was;

1. Worm immediately every day or second day for a week, weekly for three weeks then back to three weekly worming.
2. Also, it is imperative you give the goat large doses (you may think over-doses but not so) of liquid iron if you want them to recover quickly. Iron Cyclene with Cobalt (for horses) is very palatable to goats and works well. The amount was 10ml daily for young kids, 15ml daily for older kids and 20 – 40ml daily for an adult depending on how bad affected they are.

I have actually given a large, normally heavy milker, 100ml daily for a couple of weeks to ensure she lived. I also boarded a doe once that was on the mend after nearly dying a month before; her vet ordered 10ml of Iron Cyclene daily for another six weeks. And it took that long for her to fully recover having been so close to death.

Any iron not used by the goat will be passed out of their body in their urine so it is safe to use in large doses and as the barber pole worm drains the goat of blood the iron mix will help keep the goat alive until enough of the worms have been killed and/or expelled and the goat has time to recover.

A goat's digestive system puts everything through it MUCH faster than other ruminants so they do not always digest and/or absorb all the nutrients from what they eat or are given (eg. wormers, oral antibiotics).

In situations when the goat has had a very heavy burden of barber pole worms, a weekly multi-vitamin injection will also help them get back on their feet quickly. (I learnt from experience, and my vet., that it was safe to give adult goats two doses during the first week then just the one weekly). Careful nursing is also required to help pull an affected goat through safely as they often dehydrate.

After 13 years of drought in most areas of Queensland and now two extremely wet springs and summers, barber pole worm has gone mad and is creating havoc in many herds and areas. While young kids are very susceptible and really need worming from two weeks of age, all age groups are being affected.

## **Worm Infestation**

Worm Infestation is a common ailment of goats and is responsible for much loss of growth, production and condition. Several species of worms infest goats, the more serious ones being the “barber pole” or “red” worm which is found in the fourth, or true, stomach, the tiny “hair” worm of the small intestine and the larger “nodule” worm of the large intestine. There are, of course, others.

Parasitic round worms produce enormous numbers of eggs which pass on to the ground in the droppings and form the source of infestation to the same and other goats. Worm eggs survive for many weeks in damp, shaded places. An important preventive measure is to expose the grazing areas and habitations of goats to the sterilizing effects of direct sunshine. This, together with drainage of damp areas, the avoidance of overstocking and systematic spelling of grazing areas by planned rotational grazing, does much to destroy worm eggs and reduce the risk of worm infestation.

Young goats have less resistance to worms than have older goats. In a programme of rotational grazing the young stock should go ahead of older ones on to the clean, fresh grazing areas.

**Symptoms:** Worms cause tissue damage to the bowel wall and as blood suckers they are a continuous drain on the goat's vitality. This is shown by loss of condition, stunted growth, a dull, staring coat, scouring, loss of appetite, sluggishness, a swelling under the jaw and reduced milk yield. All symptoms are more pronounced in younger animals and in those that are incorrectly (including insufficiently) fed.

**Treatment:** In addition to other preventive measures goats should be drenched from time to time to keep their worm burden to a minimum. Drenching is therefore preventive as well as curative.” [1]

In Hungerford's Diseases of Livestock, there is a very large section on sheep worms with a small one for goats and they recommend reading the sheep section for information as most of the worms are the same. The following extracts are from both the goat and sheep sections (so please think “goat” anywhere it says “sheep”).

“It will be noted in the check list of parasites for the different hosts that most of the sheep parasites infest the goat. Heavy infestations with large stomach worm (*Haemonchus contortus*) are extremely common and very damaging, causing anaemia, harsh coat, and cessation of milk yield. The small, black scour worm (*Trichostrongylus*) is also a common inhabitant, causing serious damage.

The small hair worms in the intestine will cause scouring and death. The large bowel worms and the nodule worms also cause serious troubles.

It is important that a regular campaign of drenching should be carried out. The nutrition of the goats should be attended to, and they should be rotated from pasture to pasture. Thus, if a 10-acre paddock is available, it is better divided into four and the goats kept on rotation over each one for three weeks, allowing the worm eggs and larvae to die before the goats are again placed back on the pasture. Such a procedure also gives a better control of the pasture plant population and facilitates correct pasture management.” [2]

“ **Worm Infestations Transmitted in the Milk:** In recent years it has been found that many species of roundworms may be transmitted from dam to offspring via the milk. The first observation was on hookworms (*Uncinaria*) in seals. Parasites of domestic animals which may be transmitted in this way include: *Toxocara Canis*, (milk – dog), *Toxocara cati* (milk – cat), *Toxocara* (*Neoascaris*) *vitulorum* (milk – cattle), *Ancylostoma caninum* (milk – dog), *Strongyloides ransomi* (pig – colostrum), *Strongyloides papillosus* (sheep – milk), *strongyloides westeri* (horse – milk). It is probable that many other species which have a migratory phase in their life cycle will also be found to have a milk-borne mode of transmission as well as the more generally recognised ways. Milk-borne infections may be manifest in the offspring early in life, and often worm eggs will be found in the faeces of new-borne animals within a week, or two, after birth.

Prevention of this type is almost impossible unless animals are raised artificially and not allowed access to the dam's milk. The tissue phases in the dam can persist for some years, and successive offspring can be infected even though the dam has not been exposed to reinfection. A proportion of the larvae are shed in the milk at successive lactations. It is essential to recognise this aspect of the epidemiology of parasitic diseases, and to adopt treatment early in life, preferably to destroy the worms while still immature and before they have begun to produce eggs to contaminate the environment. It is particularly important to

recognise this situation with parasites, which may be transmitted to man, e.g. *Toxocara canis*. Treatment of puppies before they are two to three weeks old is essential if contamination of their surroundings is to be prevented, and children associated with them are to be protected against infection.” [3]

### “ WORM PARASITES OF THE FOURTH STOMACH IN SHEEP

#### The Large Stomach Worm (*Haemonchus contortus*):

Also known as the barber's pole worm or twisted wire worm. This is slender  $\frac{1}{2}$  - 1  $\frac{1}{2}$  inches long, and has a twisted, red striping which can be seen when closely examined. **From 500-1,000 worms** will cause symptoms. The potential menace of this parasite is realised by noting that an adult female may lay 5,000 eggs every 24 hours, so that a sheep with 300 such adults may spread 1,500,000 eggs per day.

It is a warm climate parasite, affects sheep during the spring, summer and autumn, and e.g. in N.S.W. is worst in the northern half of the state.

The membranes of the eye and mouth and the skin are pale, and rapid loss of condition occurs. Emaciation and the collection of dropsical fluid under the jaw (**bottle jaw**) and a depraved appetite (dirt eating) may be features of the infestation, but on the other hand fat sheep may be seriously affected and die while still fat, in the case of serious infestations. Under experimental infestations, sheep may die within three weeks. In the paddock, heavy infestations may produce death in four to five weeks. Usually, the sheep is not scoured unless other parasites are causing it. Sheep of all ages may be affected, in contrast to infection with black scour worms and thin-necked intestinal worms where young sheep are affected. In sudden and severe infestations the worms may literally bleed the sheep to death (as they cause damage through bloodsucking) before the animal has time to lose much condition. Affected sheep may show surprising lack of stamina when driven by dogs. It should be noted that while a high plane of nutrition is of importance, it is not nearly as effective in assisting control with the large stomach worm, as it is in the case of the smaller hair-worms.

It has been demonstrated in England (and it happens here) that larvae of this worm sometimes undergo retarded development. Instead of developing into adults within a few weeks, they burrow under the stomach wall and remain there for several months. In this position they resist drenching and may later emerge into the stomach and complete their normal development. In England, this occurs in autumn.

McKenna (1973), in New Zealand, found that *Haemonchus contortus* larvae were inhibited at an early fourth larval stage in the abomasum of sheep. He found that this is apparently the normal method by which the parasite over-winters.

The “self-cure” phenomenon is seen typically with this parasite. If sheep carry moderate infestation of *Haemonchus contortus* and then receive a further heavy dose of larvae, the sheep may immediately throw off both the new and the old infection due to an immune “anaphylaxis” – like response. LAZI-HAY is Compressed and Cryovac Packed Lucerne. The hay is compressed and packed in bags containing 7 x 2kg "biscuits" (approx. 14kg) and there are no preservatives or water added. The vacuum packing makes it impossible for the protein and moisture level in the lucerne when it is packed, to escape even in the driest conditions. As an example, a 15hh stabled horse only requires 1 x 2kg biscuit morning and night. This looks to be a great product.
