Ekka Young Judges Report

In this newsletter we feature the three young judges who are members of the DGSA. It was my pleasure to be invited to be the over-judge of the virtual judging competition for young judges that replaced the hands-on competition this year, because of Corona Virus restrictions.

The young judges were required to judge four Anglo Nubian does varying in age and stages of gestation. All does were good representatives of their breed, showing no disqualifications. All being dry disadvantaged them a little, as the udder is often the critical factor in placing one over the other. It was also challenging in that competitors were viewing the does on a screen and not in real time, but all of them shortlisted to give comments, did a great job.

Generally, I found that both the junior and senior competitors spoke confidently and with conviction. Those that used a prompt, such as the still photos, a computer screen showing the four does, or even having real goats behind them while giving explanations to justify placings, did better than those that just spoke to the camera. This could be a good point of information for future virtual competitions. All participants made a good effort to justify placings. And although there was only a short time allowed for the presentations, those young judges that did not hurry their comments were able to give more than one reason as to why one goat was placed over another and scored better.

Congratulations to first place junior judge, **Torino Brodie**.

My comments about Torino's judging were:

- Torino, you confidently and logically presented valid reasons for your placings, acknowledging superior and inferior points of each doe. Although your placings differed to mine, your reasonings were very acceptable.
- You were a very well-presented young judge and have enormous potential.
- A particularly good effort!

Congratulations to first place senior judge, **Jasmine Wilson**.

My comments about Jasmine's judging were:

- Good use of terminology and you explained clearly why one goat was placed above the other.
- Your assessment was quite accurate, although mentioning the mammary system when making comparisons would have enhanced your presentation.
- I like the positive comments throughout your judging of the class.
- You gave a genuinely nice summation at the conclusion of your judging.
- A particularly good job Jasmine.

Congratulations to Chloe Wilson who was placed third in the senior competition.

My comments about Chloe's judging were:

- Accurate observations and clear explanation as to why the first-placed doe was selected.
- Comparisons were very succinct.
- However, I would have liked one or two other conformation or breed type characteristics to be used when justifying your placings.
- This would have strengthened it, never-the-less you did a very good job and it was great to watch your presentation.
- Well done!

Part 2 – Journey of a Lifetime

In the July/September edition of the Queensland Branch Newsletter I told the story of the first time I visited Saanen, Switzerland, in the midst of winter.

This time last year, my friend and I were fortunate enough to travel to Austria, Switzerland and Croatia. How times change! No doubt Corona Virus has impacted any future plans of travel, so its memories and photos that have to suffice, as the World battles this horrendous pandemic.



Flying into Vienna we spent several days in this delightful historical city, with the highlight for me being a bedazzled spectator at the Dancing Spanish Horse performance, featuring the stunning Lipizzaner stallions.

In what seemed a blink of the eye, we farewelled Vienna and boarded the fast train to Innsbruck, twice home of the Winter Olympics in 1964 and 1976. Again, we were not disappointed by the magnificent scenery shooting past as the train reached speeds in excess of 200 kms/hr. It took us to Innsbruck, through green fields, high mountains capped with snow and quaint buildings set in picturesque pastures looking back over the valleys the train sped through. Innsbruck is such a beautiful city, with many buildings dating back to medieval times, set on the banks of the River Inn, and squeezed between steep mountains, shrouded in mist and fog.





This city is the fifth largest city in Austria and one of the most captivating places I have ever seen.

On one wet and cloudy day we rugged up and took off to climb to the top of Innsbruck, Mt Hafelekar on the Innsbrucker Nordkettenbahnen cable car, that climbs the 2300 metre slope steeply and quickly. Although, cloudy and misty, the prevailing winds would grip the cloud and shoot it away over the peak

of the mountain allowing spectacular vistas to open up, taking your breath away as you gazed out at the green valley below.

The funicular made a few stops as locals travelled up and down Mt Hafelekar. However, the stop that enticed us to disembark, was at the Alpine Zoo (Alpenzoo). Situated in an amazing park like setting on the steep slopes of the mountain, the zoo is home to a large number of alpine dwelling animals, including the Alpine Goat, bred to be a hardy animal meeting the requirements of small-scale farming in the Alps. These goats are older breeds, with large horns, thick coats, short compact bodies and just irresistible to goat lovers. I spent much of my time at the zoo hand feeding, patting and enjoying the does and their kids who were snugly tucked away under hay racks.



This little unexpected meeting with Alpine goats was a great part of our holiday and one to be remembered for a long time.

We had a lovely night with Trevor and his family and enjoyed looking at all the goats. the Nigerians totally blew us away in their correctness and cuteness and their dairy characteristics. A different trip home. We planned to go a lot slower, but borders were starting to close quickly. we had panels for the goats to camp out of the trailer. We also had to milk as we had some Saanen milkers on board as well. We crossed into South Australia, stopping for fuel became a challenge. People were bumper to bumper trying to get home. We camped well away from anyone and finally crossed into Queensland the evening before the border closed. Goondiwindi racecourse was packed with caravans. The next evening, we were home settling the goats in.

9000 km in a mammoth trip

Life settled back in at Rivendell while the world went mad. We joined our little does to a very special pure bred 100% boy. We had 3 does, but we then went on to purchase another special doe and her daughter. Angelique had already gained her Australia champion. We were on our way. Our first doe kidded Quads 2 does and 2 bucks. We wethered the boys and have retained the two doe kids. These will be our first Glendowen Nigerians. our 2nd girl kidded a single boy. We sold him very quickly and now we are waiting for our other girls to kid. We are milking 3 Nigerians now. They have lovely udders and are delightful girls, very easy to handle. I liken them to little old men. They are very placid and have lovely personalities. They have won our hearts and fitted into our lives very well. We can't wait to start showing them in Qld

Welcome and Acknowledgement of Country: Flemming Vejle

Confirmation of the minutes of the previous committee meeting held on 19th July 2020.

Amendment moved: Raewyn Bruce/Kerry Ambler that the minutes show that the following amendment, "Karen Coghill addressed the meeting by phone link, requesting the committee answer her questions from email 13/7/20. Patricia Colbran explained how the non-payment had occurred." Be amended to show, that "this was prior to 2015".

- The minutes now reads, "Karen Coghill addressed the meeting by phone link, requesting the committee answer her questions from email 13/7/20. Patricia Colbran explained how the non-payment had occurred prior to 2015."

Carried

Moved: Kate Thomson / Rosalyn Flux that the minutes as circulated are a true record of the meeting. Carried

Actions arising from the minutes:

- **Federal management of nominations for committee:**

- Are being handled by the Federal Secretary.
- Nominations have been posted to Queensland Branch Members.
- Nominations close with the Federal Secretary on 26th August.
- Late nominations will not be accepted unless they are clearly post-dated 26/8/20 or earlier.
- A donation of \$2,000 has been received from an anonymous Victorian donor to assist with the elections of an incoming management committee and the AGM.
- The Federal Secretary is working on a process to manage voting and recording who has voted to assist with the ballot at the AGM. The Branch will be advised shortly.
- Committee agreed to have two Queensland Branch members nominated as scrutineers. (**Note:** The Queensland Branch Constitution states, "voting shall be by postal votes and a show of hands or a division of members, unless not less than one-fifth of the members present demand a ballot, in which event there shall be a secret ballot. **The Chairman shall appoint two members to conduct the secret ballot in such manner as he shall determine** and the result of the ballot as declared by the chairman shall be deemed to be the resolution of the meeting at which the ballot demanded:").
- Committee members suggested a range of members who would be suitable scrutineers.
- Discussion occurred regarding having all members vote using the postal ballot. However, the constitution (see above note) does not allow this.

- **Protocols and roles and responsibility update**

- Draft including responsibilities for notifying management committee changes to Office of Fair-Trading (OFT), payment of annual fees for secretary and treasurer were endorsed.
- Further work required to include all committee members responsibility to ensure OFT returns and payments are made on time.

- As well as office bearers, the protocols are to include roles and responsibilities for auxiliary members of committee and off-committee members who undertake service roles for the membership.
- **Office of Fair-Trading Incorporated Associations Guide** have been received and distributed to committee members.
- **Queensland Health advice on holding shows.** The following points were discussed:
 - Queensland Health on 21/7/20 confirmed that shows can be held, providing less than 100 people attend, it is outdoors and a COVID Safety Checklist is displayed.
 - Social distancing and safe practises must be adhered to and include:
 - A statement that says this is a COVID safe site
 - Contact details are required for tracing purposes upon entry
 - Practicing social distancing, i.e. 1.5 metres between exhibitors
 - Washing hands regularly
 - Following the rules to keep us all safe.
 - Additionally, the safety plan will advise exhibitors, judge and stewards to wear coats; the judge to wear gloves when handling udders and a mask if approaching the exhibitor to handle the exhibit. Stewards checking tattoos to wear a mask, coat and gloves. Gloves and masks will be provided by the Branch.
