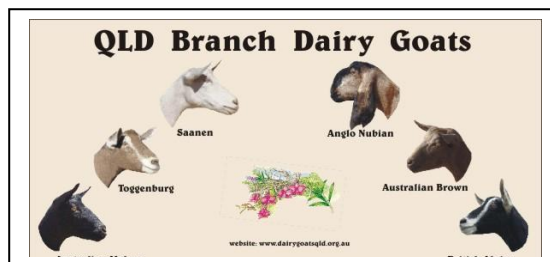

NOTICES OF MOTION FOR THE 2020 AGM

Queensland Branch DGSA Inc A.G.M.

MOTION 1

REGULATION 15.1: be changed to read:

The Management Committee shall meet at least once every two months to exercise its functions, with these meetings to be *conducted physically and using any technology that reasonably allows members to hear and take part in discussions as they happen.*

MOTION 2

CLAUSE 15.2: be changed to read:

“A special meeting of the Management Committee shall be convened by the secretary on the requisition in writing signed by not less than one-third of the members of the Management Committee, which requisition shall clearly state the reasons why such special meeting is being convened and the nature of the business to be transacted thereat. *These meetings are to be conducted physically and or using any technology that reasonably allows members to hear and take part in discussions as they happen.*”

MOTION 3

CLAUSE 16.1: be changed to read: “The Management Committee may delegate any of its powers to a sub-committee consisting of such members of the Association as the Management Committee thinks fit. Any sub-committee so formed shall in the exercise of the powers so delegated conform to any regulations that may be imposed on it by the Management Committee. *These meetings are to be conducted physically and or using any technology that reasonably allows members to hear and take part in discussions as they happen.*”

MOTION 4

ANNUAL GENERAL AND GENERAL MEETINGS

CLAUSE 20.1: be changed to read:

The annual general meeting shall be held within three months of the close of the financial year, such meeting to be *conducted physically and or using any technology that reasonably allows members to hear and take part in discussions as they happen.*

MOTION 5

CLAUSE 11.1: be changed to read:

The Management committee of the Association shall consist of a President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, Central and North Queensland Representatives, all of whom shall be members of the Association, and such number of members as the members of the Association at any general meeting may from time to time elect or appoint. *The lines of latitude used to define the areas of Queensland being South of the 26th parallel to be included in South Queensland; Between the 22nd and the 26th parallel to be Central Queensland; North of the 22nd parallel to be North Queensland."*

MOTION 6

CLAUSE 11.3 a): be changed to read:

Any two members of the Association shall be at liberty to nominate any other member to serve as an officer or other member of the Management Committee *which includes the regional representatives who must reside in the area for which they are nominated to act.*

REASONS FOR THE FOLLOWING MOTIONS

REASON 1

Members are spread across the state and distance makes it impossible for many to attend a physical meeting. By using the internet and other electronic means to hold meetings the opportunity for all members to participate is opened so therefore all interested members can stand for committee positions and can participate easily in the meetings.

REASON 2

If the Branch adopts the electronic meetings it necessitates some minor alterations to several other regulations as set out below.

By stating *communication technology*, it leaves the decision up to the committee in office at the time to decide which method of electronic meeting they prefer.

REASON 3

The motion regarding the definition of North, Central, and South has not been recorded and this is mainly housekeeping.

Reference

56 Meetings using communication technology

- (1) An incorporated association may hold meetings, or permit members to take part in its meetings, by using any technology that reasonably allows members to hear and take part in discussions as they happen.*

Example of use of technology—

teleconferencing

(2) A member who participates in a meeting under subsection (1) is taken to be present at the meeting.

NEWS AND VIEWS

Is your organisation ready for the new blue card laws?

New blue card system laws will take effect from **Monday 31 August 2020**.

- i. If you do not have a blue card you cannot hold a position on committee, be a steward or be a judge.
- ii. People can [apply for their blue or exemption cards online](#)
- iii. New paper forms will be available on 31 August for those who are not able to apply online.
- iv. You must apply for your new card before the current expires. Failure to do so will mean you are not able to hold the above positions
- v. New blue cards and exemption cards from 31 August will also carry a photo
- vi. Cards must be linked to the association
- vii. It is the responsibility of the card holder to inform Blue Card Services if there is a change to their police information and failure to do so may result in a maximum penalty of \$13,345.
- viii. “After 31 August, people won’t need a blue card if they don’t work or volunteer with children for more than 7 days in a calendar year. If the child-related work is more than 7 days, they will need a blue card.
There is no minimum frequency for people who run a regulated child-related business.
The 7-day frequency test will replace all other frequency tests. Find out more about the [frequency test](#).”
- ix. There are transitional provisions for people who submitted applications before 31 August 2020 that are still being processed when the new laws commence. Those applications will be processed under the previous laws.

Welcome and acknowledgement of the traditional owners of the land.

Confirmation of the minutes of the AGM 30th June 2018

Moved E Rogers Seconded G Hunter "that the minutes as circulated are a true record of the Annual General Meeting held on 30/6/18." **CARRIED**

Business arising from the minutes - nil

Moved I Millett Seconded K Thomson "that the Treasurer's report be accepted,
and accounts passed for payment." CARRIED

financial period ending 31 March 2020." CARRIED

As there was a submission of an amendment to the motion that was advertised
and as there are no committee positions to be voted on, the meeting was happy
to vote by show of hands, therefore scrutineers were not required at this
meeting.

Motion advertised for AGM

Motion for QLD Branch DGSA INC 2019 AGM.

In dot 3 of the Role of the Liaison Officer on page 23 of the 2019 branch book it
states, and I quote," To forward **all** original results of their show to the secretary
within 21 days of the show with a copy to the DD convenors, retain a copy for
themselves, and forward result page directly to the editor."

In 1917 this committee has used this rule to withhold show points changing the
Dairy Doe and Dairy Doe Kid points dramatically.

Due to this we would like to put forward the following motion.

Moved: R Bruce, **Seconded:** L Morley,

"That the committee not use these rules to penalise members who through no fault
of their own have lost show points or who will lose show points in the future if this
rule is applied as it has in the past."

REASON

The exhibitors have spent time and money to attend shows to promote dairy goats
and by withholding points can deter members from attending shows.

On behalf of all the Liaison officers, I would ask that this committee give these
people more support and put in place actions that will encourage and show empathy
for the time and hard work they put into organising a DGSA section at shows.

Many of these people work and/or run a business. They give up their own time to promote the DGSA at Ag Shows and this is often when they do not have spare time themselves. They give up their time to keep the DGSA and our dairy goats in the public eye.

The liaison officer should be given 'every assistance' as shows are the showcase for our dairy goats. The action taken by this committee can only deter members from taking on this role.

The committee needs to consider the DGSA no longer has a monopoly on Dairy Goats. We need to support members and encourage the exhibitors and show liaison officers who are essential for the promotion of the DGSA and our dairy goats.

The above motion was deemed to be out of order and the motion below is an amendment put by Mr Tom Byrne:

Moved: Tom Byrne Seconded K Thomson "that the amendment below be adopted."

Rescind the rule re role of the liaison officer, point 3 on page 23 of the 2019 Branch Book which reads:

"To forward all original results of their show to the Secretary within 21 days of the show with a copy to the DD convenors, retain a copy for themselves, and forward result page directly to Newsletter Editor."

And replace with:

"To forward all original results of their show to the Secretary within 21 days of the show with a copy to the DD convenors, retain a copy for themselves, and forward result page directly to Newsletter Editor. ***Where the show results have not been received in this time frame, the Branch Secretary is to contact the liaison officer offering a week's extension and assistance.***"

Discussion took place regarding the motion and R Bruce withdrew the original motion.

Milk Awards were announced and presented with the permission the meeting.

Vote of thanks to the outgoing committee members. P Colbran presented certificates of appreciation to those no longer on the committee.

Election of Officers

F Vejle has been nominated unopposed for the position of Vice-President. K Ambler, R Bruce, R Flux, L Morley, and K Thomson have been nominated to the Qld Management Committee. K Coghill has indicated that she is interested

in the position of CQ Rep and would need to have a nominee and seconder to have this recognised and accepted as the position is at this time unopposed. Moved E Rogers Seconded R Bruce "that K Coghill be accepted as the Central Queensland Representative for committee." CARRIED

Whilst the general number of committee members in the past has been 10, in Herd Book vol 66, Regulation 85 states "A Branch Committee must consist of not less than six member, including a Branch President, Branch Vice-President, Branch Secretary and Branch Honorary Treasurer, elected annually by the Branch members." This being so the seven nominated members can be accepted as the Management Committee if no further nominations are taken from the floor.

I [Patricia Colbran] now declare the committee positions vacant and hand over to the Vice-President elect, Flemming Vejle.

Cost to be reimbursed. • Australia Post branch account transactions to be requested by secretary. • Treasurer and president to take minutes of this meeting to branch bank to register treasurer's signature and get balance of branch account. • Kate Thomson suggested that the treasurer have internet access to get point in-time details of the branch bank account, allowing better reporting.
