• **Bucks or does over 12 months** will only be registered in the Identification Register (IR) or App D sections, whichever is applicable. Refer to Regulation 16 (f) page 306 in the 2019 Herd Book Vol 67.

• **When a breeder registers 20 or more kids** in any one financial year (1st July to 30th June), the breeder may then register additional kids born in that year at 50% discount of the specified fee. Regulation 20 (a) in the 2020 Herd Book Vol 68.

• **When a financial member effects 10 or more transfers** in one financial year (1st July to 30th June) a discount of 50% will apply for the additional transfers affected. The application for this discount must be made in writing to the Federal Secretary listing and naming the first 10 kids transferred. Regulation 34 (a) 2020 Herd Book Vol 68.

DAIRY GOAT SOCIETY OF AUSTRALIA LTD CODE OF ETHICS

This Code of Ethics establishes a standard of conduct to be followed by all members of the D.G.S.A. Ltd. in the normal course of owning, breeding, milk testing, exhibiting for show and selling of dairy goats. Breeders must be aware of their responsibilities and aim at all times to conscientiously maintain the highest possible standards for production and type of dairy goats.

As a Member of the D.G.S.A Ltd. I hereby agree that:

- ❖ I will abide by the D.G.S.A. Ltd. Articles of Association and Regulations.
- ❖ I will at all times, whether at home, travelling, at shows or in public places, display good sportsmanship and conduct myself in such a manner as will reflect credit on the D.G.S.A. Ltd. and dairy goats
- ❖ I will help to educate the public about dairy goats and in all other areas where I am qualified. I will try to breed in such a manner as to improve the quality of dairy goats.
- ❖ I will not knowingly use for breeding any animal with major defects or hereditary diseases.
- ❖ I will sell only animals in good healthy condition, free to the best of my knowledge from communicable disease.
- ❖ I will not sell any registered dairy goat that has defects of a nature that is detrimental to the breed/s.
- ❖ I will deregister any animal developing disqualifying faults.
- ❖ I will not sell stock without true representation to the purchaser. All advertising will be honest and not in any way misrepresentative, misleading or fraudulent.
- ❖ I will ensure that registration and transfer of stock will be completed promptly, and that any purchaser clearly understands their responsibilities for the care and welfare of the animal/s.

PAPERWORK - WHAT IS REQUIRED



HERD BOOK ENTRY FORMS – Registrations

1. Supplied in books of 10 pages; 5 entries per page, plus duplicates for **your records**. Available from the Branch or Federal Secretary, \$8.80. or an electronic version is available.
2. Herd Book entry form for App. "D" does **must** be accompanied by an **Inspection Certificate** signed by an approved Branch Inspector (see list in this book) or by a member of the Judges Panel, stating that it's conformation, type and breed colour conform to the breed standards and it is free from disqualifying faults. **OR Inspection form by Owner** with 2 (two) colour photos, i.e. 1 each full side-on-view photographs of the animal along with the appropriate fee to be sent to the Branch Secretary before the application can be considered. If approved, the application will be forwarded to the Federal Secretary. A Herd Book entry form for kids whose sire is not owned by the owner of the Dam must be accompanied by a Buck Service Certificate signed by the owner of the buck. This buck must be registered with the D.G.S.A. **Numbered section kids may only be registered from a numbered section buck and an App A. or numbered section doe.** It is advisable for the owners of kids, who will be progeny of an outside service, to own a book of Service Certificates so a Service Certificate is at hand when paying the service fee. See Eligibility for Registration, Regulation 16.

TRANSFERS.

The transfer form is on the reverse side of a goat's Registration Certificate. This form should be filled in and signed at the time of sale or lease and should be lodged with the Federal Secretary, fee \$18.00, as soon as possible after the sale or lease. The new owner will receive a Registration Certificate with themselves recorded as the owner.

Should the goat be resold or leased the transfer on the reverse of this Registration Certificate must be used.

NB: you can obtain transfer forms to keep at home for completing at the time of sale of young kids and forward to the Federal Secretary with the registration form and payment.

A goat must be transferred whether the new owner is a member or non-member. If sold to a non-member, the goat **MUST** be ear tagged with an NLIS tag when leaving the property. Only DGSA Members have ear tagging exemption, and therefore all goats **MUST** be tattooed.

The form has provision for a date to be nominated on which the lease expires and, if an expiry date is filled in, the goat's ownership (registration) reverts to the previous owner on that date. A double transfer fee must be paid in such cases.

SERVICE CERTIFICATES.

Supplied in books of 20 forms (in duplicate). Cost \$5.50 plus postage and handling. These are available from the Branch Secretary.

A **Service Certificate** must be issued for **all** does served by a registered buck when the doe is not owned by the owner of the buck. A Certificate of Service must accompany any application for registration of kids sired by a buck not owned by the owner of the dam, but will only be recognized by the D.G.S.A. for this purpose, if the buck is registered and the owner of the buck is a financial member of the D.G.S.A **at the time the service took place and the certificate was issued.**

DEATH & CULL FORM.

Available from the branch website, or branch secretary if member has no internet access. A Death & Cull form should be lodged with the Federal Secretary in respect of any registered goat which dies, is sold on export, or is culled (removed from the register) of the Herd Book.

MEMBERSHIP APPLICATION

Forms are available from the branch website, or branch secretary if member has no internet access, at no cost other than to cover postage. Forward completed application form to the **Federal Secretary**, with subscription & prefix fees. The Federal Secretary will check to ensure that this prefix is unique. Application is then confirmed by the state committee. The new member will then receive a Welcome Pack from the Branch.

MEMBERSHIP RENEWAL

Forms are sent directly to members by the Federal Secretary. Return to Federal Secretary with subscription fee **before** 31st December.

N.B. - MEMBERSHIP RENEWAL IS DUE ANNUALLY BY 31st DECEMBER.
IF NOT PAID BY 31st DECEMBER YOU WILL HAVE TO RE-APPLY TO RE-JOIN THE SOCIETY
AND FEES WILL APPLY

MILK PRODUCTION RECORDING

HERD RECORDING: All breeders should realise the importance of their breeding operations on both type and production. The successful breeder is one who breeds animals that have good type, long life and high production.

N.B.: If wishing to commence herd recording you must obtain an Application Form and a Monitors Certificate if applicable, from the state website or Branch Secretary. Complete the Application Form and forward it to the State Milk Awards Officer before commencing herd recording. Please refer to the herd book for current regulations and ensure that no milk products are fed to does being tested as this will negate any awards.

Recommended Scales: GEO SALTER 10Kg or BRANCH APPROVED.

DAIRY EXPRESS offers a Herd Recording service to goat keepers involving the regular measurement of milk, protein, butterfat production and cell counts with the systematic recording of cumulative figures. In some cases, Dairy Express can put you in touch with a contractor who will perform these services, but this is more expensive and difficult to arrange, and you will need to negotiate the price for this with the contractor.

Members should contact **Dairy Express on 02 6773 5240 or Free-call 1800 633 165** to arrange for recording of your herd and to get up-to-date information on fees.

Price per doe varies depending if recording is done at 30, 45, or 60-day intervals.

HOW TO CLAIM DISTINGUISHING MARKS FOR HERD RECORDING

A member's herd recording figures will be accepted for QLD Branch and Society awards provided that:

1. The member submits a written claim for the award to the Branch Milk Awards Officer with appropriate fee and a completed Monitors Certificate.
2. The figures are obtained through a recognised scheme.
3. A verified copy of the production report is submitted with the claim and the production report lists each individual recording of the doe.
4. In claiming "R" figures, the herd recorder is not a member of the immediate family or a household member.
5. The name/s of the herd recorder/s who completed the recording must be submitted on each Recording sheet.
6. The Branch has the right to investigate any aspect of the member's herd recording at any time.
7. The herd recorder uses recommended equipment for measuring production.
8. The herd recorder is trained by a recognised service provider or is a Qld Branch DGSA approved trainer.
9. Farmer Own Sampling and Combination Recording using Farmer Own Sampling and Monitored Recording which includes three 24 Hour Tests, must comply with Federal Regulations 70 and 71, Herd Book Vol 68.
10. All does must have their first herd recording test within 90 days of kidding for all figures.

11. Society awards, which are incorporated in the goat's name, are made for the attainment of minimum production levels measured under Branch approved schemes. Details of the distinguishing marks awarded by the Society are set out under Federal Regulations 66 - 84 inclusive.
12. All distinguishing marks awarded by the Society for both bucks and does, whether based on 24-hour production tests or on herd recording, must be approved by the Federal Milk Awards Officer before they can be used in advertising etc. The Branch Milk Awards Officer forwards applications to the FMAO, with relevant fees.
13. Whilst waiting on FMAO approval, members will have an authorised record of claim provided by the Branch MAO for the purpose of showing in Type and Production classes. This permit is valid for a two-month period from the date of qualifying.

"R" & "F" figures, Section Marks, etc: Application for these awards must be made to the State Milk Test Officer [SMTO] on claim forms, which are available from the Branch Secretary or the Milk Test Officer and on the branch website.

NB: Retain a copy of all claims & original supporting documents.

Cost: \$4.40 per claim payable to D.G.S.A. Ltd.

24 HOUR PRODUCTION TESTS: 24-hour production tests can also be arranged, and awards are made for minimum levels of production achieved at these tests.

The tests are arranged and supervised by the Branch (not Dairy Express). You need to engage a recognised DGSA Approved Tester to officiate.

The Branch recognises 2 styles of 24-hour tests:

- ◆ 24-hour test only. Cost per test - \$5 application fee and \$2 per goat tested (subject to change).
- ◆ 24-hour test combined with Herd Recording. \$10 each test for any number of does at **any one test**; and **each** subsequent test at a different time will incur a further \$10 fee.

PLEASE NOTE - any entries in the RNA milk test are exempt from these fees.

The Branch does not pay Milk Test Recorders. It is customary for the organizer of a milk test to offer the Milk Test Recorder their expenses.

Written requests for these tests, together with the appropriate fee, should be made direct to the SMTO, **at least 1 week prior to the test**. Application form is on the branch website or available from the SMTO and the following information must be provided with a request for a 24-hour milk test.

1. Name, address and phone number of the Organiser (the person arranging the test).
2. Proposed location and date of test.
3. Whether test is purely a 24-hour test or is combined with herd recording.
4. Minimum and maximum number of goats likely to be tested (please advise carefully).
5. Name of recorder who has agreed to supervise test or request for the Branch to appoint a recorder. It is preferred that the organizer arranges for a recorder where possible.
6. Names and addresses of assistant recorders, if applicable.
7. In the case of a 24-hour test only, proposed method by which the samples are to be returned to the relevant laboratories.
8. Any other relevant information pertaining to the test, e.g., accommodation available for recorders & goats, availability of meals, etc.
9. Claims for these awards to be made to the Milk Test Officer. including a \$4.40 cheque made payable to D.G.S.A. Ltd, or direct deposit for each claim. **Please include Herd Book numbers on form.**
10. Members advertising Milk Awards in any promotional articles or advertisements **MUST** have the written proof of these Milk Awards to substantiate such claims.

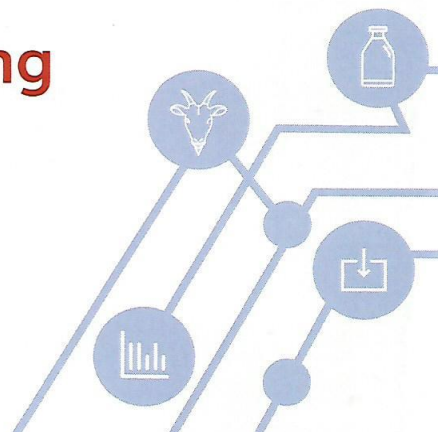

REQUIREMENTS FOR:
AUSTRALIAN CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS - DOES

The following notes are presented as a guide to allotting points to Breed Champions. The system, as stated in the Federal Constitution and Regulations can be difficult to interpret. Hopefully these notes will be more easily understood.

1. The awarding of Australian Champion & Dairy Doe points are calculated differently - **do not confuse the two systems.**
2. Only does over 12 months are allowed points.
3. **The Champion of each breed**, who is over 12 months, gains points on the following basis:
 - * 5 points for winning breed champion.
 - * 1 point for each doe of her breed **over** 12 months **including** herself.
 - * The minimum points a breed champion can earn is 6. i.e. 5 for champion & 1 for herself.
4. The Supreme Champion Doe, or Best Doe Exhibit, receives breed champion points as above and, **in addition**, she receives 1 point for **every** doe **over** 12 months shown in the other breed classes.
5. Supreme Champion doe, or Best Doe Exhibit, can only gain a **maximum** of 20 points at any one show.
6. The steward is responsible for calculating points, but judges are usually willing to assist.
7. **The official card should be signed by both the steward and judge.**
8. Breed Champions do not gain points for beating does which are shown but disqualified.
e.g. A Toggenburg doe is Breed Champion. There were 4 other Toggenburg does over 12 months. She gains 5 points for winning Breed Champion, 1 point for herself and 4 for other does of her breed. She gains 10 points. This doe is also Supreme Champion or Best Doe Exhibit. There were 8 Saanen does over 12 months, 6 British Alpine does over 12 months, and 3 Anglo Nubian does over 12 months. Total points are $10 + 8 + 6 + 3 = 27$. However, the **maximum allowable points** are 20. She therefore receives 20 points.

REQUIREMENTS FOR:
AUSTRALIAN CHAMPION POINTS - BUCKS

An award entitled 'Australian Champion Buck Award' shall be made to a Registered Buck which has met the following requirements:

- Has gained a minimum of 40 points in the show ring plus
- A minimum of 60 points to be obtained by doe progeny.
- A minimum of 100 points is required to be awarded an Australian Championship.
- To gain award points through showing – buck or progeny - the show must be a recognised show.

FOR AWARDING SHOW RING POINTS:

1. 5 points for winning Breed Champion Buck **plus** 1 point for each male of his breed shown over 12 months of age. A minimum of 6 points, a maximum of 20 points.
2. Supreme Champion Buck, **in addition** to Champion Buck points (as above), 1 point for each male of other breeds shown over 12 months of age. A maximum of only 20 points may be awarded.

FOR AWARDING PROGENY POINTS:

1. Each doe sired by the buck may gain a maximum of 5 points for any of the following awards - *, Q*, *Q*, or herd recording figures of R090 or better - **N.B.** only 1 award may be claimed.
2. Each doe sired by the buck may gain 3 points for each Breed Champion awarded.
3. Each doe sired by the buck may gain 5 points for each Supreme Champion awarded.
4. Each doe sired by the buck may gain 10 points for an Australian Champion award.
5. Each doe sired by the buck is entitled to a maximum of 20 points towards the buck's Australian CH.
6. The total of 100 points must be gained under **at least** 3 different judges.
7. The system is to be administered at Branch level. However, it is the responsibility of the individual owners to maintain a record of points gained. The Branch **will not** record points.
8. Should a buck under 12 months of age be selected as Champion Buck **NO** points will be awarded. If in the opinion of the judge, none of the bucks are of high enough standard, Champion Buck points should be withheld.
9. There is no time limit for acquiring points and all points are transferable.

REQUIREMENTS FOR **DAIRY DOE OF THE YEAR COMPETITION**

This award is to be conducted annually by the Queensland Branch of the D.G.S.A. Inc. commencing on the **1st January** and terminating on the **31st December** each year. Points gained at the RNA will be awarded according to age as per rules. The certificate will be presented at the 1st suitable occasion after the announcement of the winner. Points will be awarded to does under the following rules. The doe gaining the highest number of points in each designated area will be the **Dairy Doe of the Year** for that area. i.e., North Queensland, Central Queensland, OR South Queensland.

- 1. Only does, over 12 months old, are eligible to gain Dairy Doe points.**
- 2. Dairy Doe points will only be awarded at shows which are conducted as fully C.A.E. free shows.**
Entries must comply with clauses 6 & 19 of the Qld Branch, D.G.S.A. Show Rules.
- 3. The judges and show schedule must be recognised by the branch committee. These are deemed to be**
recognised unless the Branch committee rules otherwise.
- 4. Points are awarded for breed/age class, udder class, best udder overall and championships as below.**

In the event of a tie, equal points will be awarded.

- 5. No points** are awarded for type & production, group, novelty, special breed feature or buck classes.
 - ◆ Only does awarded 1st, 2nd or 3rd place in their respective age class are eligible to earn points for that show.
 - ◆ If no doe is awarded a 1st place in the age class, then no other does within that class are eligible for points. If a 1st place is awarded in the age class and no 2nd place is awarded, then no other doe exhibited in that age class (excepting the 1st exhibit) is eligible to earn points for that show.
 - ◆ The doe will be awarded 1 point for each doe that she beats, plus a point for herself. Note: excluding Best Udder points, a doe can gain a maximum of 40 points at any one show.
 - ◆ Total points cannot include beating the same doe twice.

Points Awarded:

- Grand/Supreme Champion – Total number of does exhibited.
- Breed Champion – Number of does exhibited of that breed.
- Reserve Champion – Number of does exhibited of that breed minus 1.
- Senior Champion & Reserve Champion will only be awarded Dairy Doe points on a schedule 1.
- Junior Champion & Reserve as per Breed and ALL BREEDS. Junior breed champions are not encouraged.
- 1st – Number of points equals the number of does in the age class.
- 2nd – number of points equals the number of does in the age class, minus 1.
- 3rd – Number of points equals the number of does in the age class, minus 2.

Best Udder Points

- ◆ When 3 or more places are awarded 1st - 3 points
2nd - 2 points
3rd - 1 point
- ◆ When 2 places are awarded 1st - 2 points
2nd - 1 point
- ◆ When 1 place is awarded 1st - 1 point
- Best Udder Overall 1 point*

Note: The doe will earn 1 point plus the maximum points of either lactation class.

Note: for the best udder overall point to be awarded there must be two or more lactation classes in the show schedule, with exhibits shown in both lactation classes. The maximum amount of points earned for the best uddered doe is 4.

- ◆ The maximum points that can be earned **per doe per show** are 44.

5. For the purpose of accumulating points, the points gained at **5 shows only** are to be considered. Those 5 shows are the shows which yield the highest number of points for each doe.

6. Points are also awarded for Milk awards as follows:

* , Q* , *Q* 20 points

RS, FS, R90, F90 or better 20 points

A maximum of 20 points may be gained by a doe for milk awards.

Milk awards may be gained prior to the year in which points are awarded. A doe may be Dairy Doe of Year without gaining a milk award. The compiler will ensure that milk award points are taken into account when compiling final figures. To claim a milk award for the current year, your claim must be lodged with the Qld Milk Awards Officer before 31st December of that year.

7. The Branch Committee will appoint a Liaison Officer for shows with a dairy goat section. The duties of

the Liaison Officer are:

Forward all original results of their show to the secretary within **21 days of the show**. The Liaison Officer is to send a copy to the Dairy Doe Compiler who will contact the show liaison officer if not received within a further 14 days. If the results are not forthcoming in that time, points for that show will not be counted. A copy is to be retained by the liaison officer. Show results page for newsletter is to be sent directly to the editor.

•The results must be on the supplied forms & each page signed by the steward & judge.

To be included on the form:

◇ Name of Show, Date of show,

◇ Name and signature of Judge and Blue card [or equivalent] number,

◇ Name and signature of Steward and Blue card [or equivalent] number,

◇ Name and signature of Liaison Officer and Blue card [or equivalent] number,

◇ **Total** number of dairy goats (including bucks),

◇ Names of all goats entered and owners and placing of goats for **all** classes,

◇ Results of all Championships.

◇ Total number of exhibits per class.

◇ Tattoo numbers for animals to be awarded Australian Champion Points.

◇ **No points will be awarded** for a show which does not meet the above requirements.

8. The Branch Committee will appoint a member of the committee to be responsible for compiling points in accordance with the results submitted. The compiler will not be responsible for resolving disputes and/or irregularities, these will be resolved by the Branch Committee. **Only** goats domiciled in Queensland are eligible to gain points.

9. Does domiciled in any of the three designated areas may acquire points at shows out of their area to be eligible for Dairy Doe points in their respective area. ..."Queensland be defined as three areas according to the lines of latitude as follows: - South of the 26th parallel to be included in South Queensland; Between the 22nd and 26th parallel to be Central Queensland; North of the 22nd parallel to be North Queensland."

10. There will only be one Dairy Doe Award for any one doe and that award to be for the area in which the doe lives at 31 December of that year. The Doe gaining the highest points will be Queensland Dairy Doe of the Year.

11. In the event of 2 or more does gaining equal points the award will be made to the doe gaining the most 1st. places during the year.

12. Points are awarded to the doe and are fully transferable with the doe. The Trophy will be awarded to the person who owns the doe at the 31st December in the year in which the points are gained.

N.B. Exhibitors are **not** required to forward claims for Dairy Doe points.

Dairy Doe Points and Dairy Doe Kid Points are won for their age group and cannot be added together.

When a member wins an award such as dairy doe, dairy doe kid, or sire of the year, it is the responsibility of the owner to provide a suitable photograph and script to the AGW editor and branch newsletter editor for publication in these periodicals.

REQUIREMENTS FOR:
DAIRY BUCK OF THE YEAR COMPETITION

This award is to be conducted annually by The Queensland Branch of The Dairy Goat Society of Australia Inc.

Commencing on the 1st of January and terminating on the 31st of December each year. The certificate will be presented at the 1st suitable occasion after the announcement of the winner. Points will be awarded to bucks under the following rules.

The buck gaining the highest number of points in each designated area will be the Dairy Buck of the year for that area for example, North Queensland, Central Queensland, or South Queensland.

- 1) Only bucks over 12 months of age are eligible to gain Dairy Buck Points.
 - 2) Dairy Buck Points will **only** be awarded at shows which are conducted as fully C.A.E free shows. Entries must comply with clauses 6 & 19 of the Queensland Branch DGSA show rules.
 - 3) The Judges and show schedule must be recognised by the Branch Committee. These are deemed to be recognised unless the Branch Committee rules otherwise.
 - 4) Points are awarded for Breed/Age Class and Championships as below. In the event of a tie, equal points will be awarded. **No Points** are awarded for group, novelty class.
- Only bucks awarded 1st, 2nd, or 3rd place in their respective age class are eligible to earn points for that show.
 - If no buck is awarded a 1st place, then no other bucks within that class are eligible for points. If a 1st place is awarded in the age class and no 2nd place is awarded, then no other bucks exhibited in that age class (excepting the 1st exhibit) are eligible to earn points for that show.
 - The buck will be awarded 1 point for each buck that he beats plus 1 point for himself.

Points Awarded:

- Grand/ Supreme Champion = Total number of Bucks exhibited
- Breed Champion = Number of bucks exhibited of that breed
- Reserve Champion = Number of bucks exhibited of that breed minus 1
- Senior Champion & Reserve Champion. Will only be awarded buck points on a schedule 1.
- Junior Champion & Reserve Champion. As per breed and all breeds.
- 1st = Number of points equals the number of bucks in the age class
- 2nd = Number of points equals the number of bucks in the age class minus 1
- 3rd = Number of points equals the number of bucks in the age class minus 3

For the purpose accumulating points

5) The points gained at 5 shows only are to be considered. Those 5 shows are the shows which yield the highest number of points for each buck.

REQUIREMENTS FOR:
QUEENSLAND BRANCH SIRE OF THE YEAR AWARD.

**This is awarded to the buck siring the most successful show does in a year,
(1st January to 31st December)**

The certificate will be presented on the 1st suitable occasion after the announcement of the winner. It will be awarded to bucks under the following rules.

1. All bucks, domiciled in Queensland, over the age of 12 months are eligible. Shows in the South Burnett, as per Dairy Doe, are included in the South Queensland area for Dairy Buck points.
2. Dairy Buck points will **only** be awarded at shows which are conducted as fully C.A.E. free shows. Entries must comply with Qld Branch, D.G.S.A. Show Rules.
3. The judges and show schedules must be recognised by the Branch Committee. These are deemed to be recognised unless the Branch Committee rules otherwise.

Bucks will gain points for their daughters on the following basis.

- 1 point for Breed Champion at a recognised show
- 3 points for Grand Champion Doe at a recognised show
- 3 points for a Milk Award (*, Q*, *Q*, RS, FS, R90, F90, or better)
- The points are awarded to all does over the age of 12 months sired by the buck
- The does may be owned by more than one exhibitor and do not need to be owned or bred by the owner or the breeder of the buck
- The Trophy to be awarded to the owner of the buck on 31st December in the year of the Award.
- The Branch will appoint a Committee person to oversee the points

REQUIREMENTS FOR:
DAIRY DOE KID OF THE YEAR COMPETITION

- * This award will be conducted annually by the Queensland Branch, D.G.S.A. Inc. commencing on the **1st January** and terminating on the **31st December** each year.
- * The certificate will be presented on the 1st suitable occasion after the announcement of the winner. It will be awarded to doe kids under the following rules.
- * The doe kid gaining the highest number of points in each designated area will be the **Dairy Doe Kid of the Year** for that area. i.e., North Queensland, Central Queensland, OR South Queensland.

All doe kids, domiciled in Queensland, **under the age of 12 months are eligible for Dairy Doe Kid points.** Shows in the South Burnett, as per Dairy Doe, are included in the South Queensland area for Dairy Doe Kid points.

1. Dairy Doe Kid points will **only** be awarded at shows which are conducted as fully C.A.E. free shows. Entries must comply with Qld Branch, D.G.S.A. Show Rules.
2. The judges and show schedules must be recognised by the Branch committee. These are deemed to be recognised unless the Branch Committee rules otherwise.
3. A kid will be awarded 1 point for every doe kid under the age of 12 months that she beats, plus a point for herself.
 - The maximum number of points awarded per show is 20 points.
 - For the purpose of accumulating points, the points gained at 5 shows only are to be considered. Those 5 shows are the shows which yield the highest number of points for each kid.
 - No points are awarded for best udder, type & production, group, novelty, special feature or buck classes.
 - Only kids awarded 1st, 2nd or 3rd place in their respective age class are eligible to earn points for that show.
 - If no kid is awarded a 1st place in the age class, then no other kids within that class are eligible for points. If a 1st place is awarded in the age class and no 2nd place is awarded, then no other kid exhibited in that age class (excepting the 1st exhibit) is eligible to earn points for that show.
 - Total points cannot include beating the same kid twice.

Points Awarded:

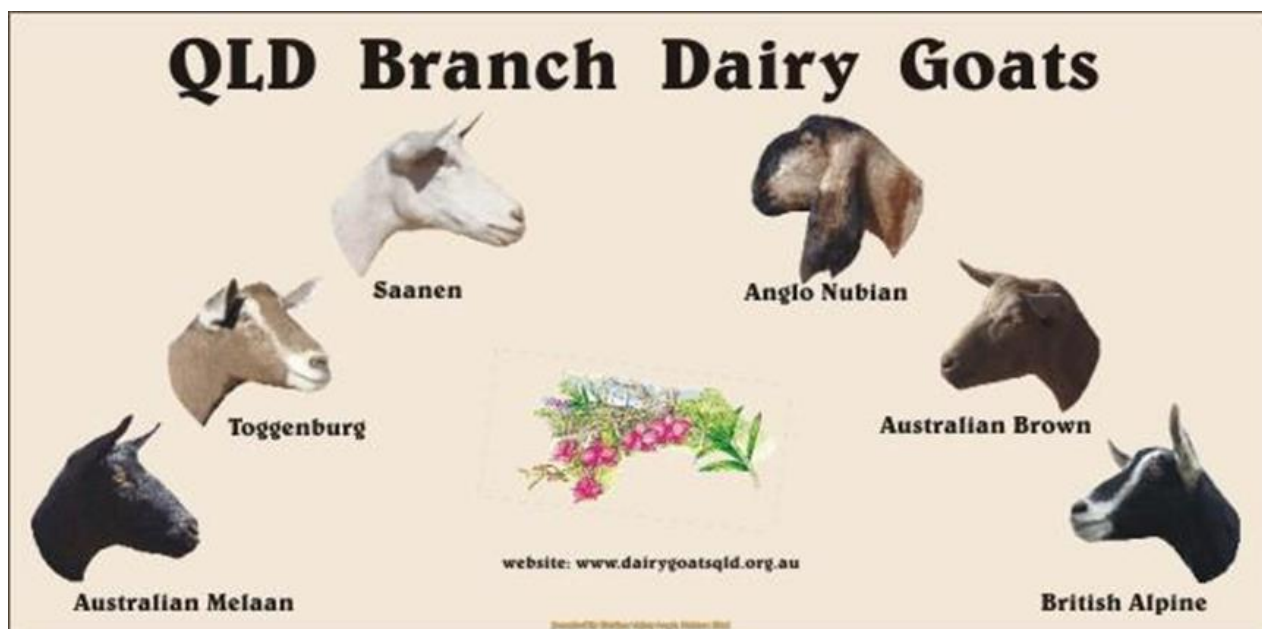
Points will be awarded for Supreme, Grand Champion, Champion or Reserve of Breed, Champion Doe Kid (& Reserve Doe Kid if awarded).

Total points for any Champion award would be total number of kids (**under** 12-month-old) exhibited. Reserve would be total minus 1 point.

1. A doe is eligible for points if she is shown in a kid class.
2. Show liaison officers will forward show results to the Dairy Doe Kid of the Year compiler on the same returns for the Dairy Doe of the Year award and the same conditions will apply.
3. Points are awarded to the kid and are fully transferable with the kid. The Trophy will be awarded to the person who owns the kid at the 31st December in the year in which the points are gained.
4. In the event of 2 kids gaining equal points, the trophy will be given to the kid who has won the most 1st places during the year.
5. The Branch Committee will appoint a member of the committee to be responsible for compiling points in accordance with the results submitted. The compiler will not be responsible for resolving disputes and/or irregularities, these will be resolved by the Branch Committee.
6. Doe Kids domiciled in any of the three designated areas may acquire points at shows out of their area to be eligible for Dairy Doe Kid points in their respective area.
7. There will be only one Dairy Doe Kid Award for any one doe kid and that award to be for the area in which the doe kid lives on 31 December of that year. The doe kid gaining the highest points will be Queensland Dairy Doe Kid of the Year.

NB Dairy Doe Points and Dairy Doe Kid Points are won for their age group and cannot be added together.

TATTOOS SHOULD BE READ FROM THE FRONT & FROM LEFT TO RIGHT.

N.B. TATTOOS SHOULD REMAIN READABLE THROUGHOUT A GOATS LIFE. CARE MUST BE TAKEN THAT TATTOOS ARE APPLIED ACCURATELY & CLEARLY. THE INK SHOULD BE WELL RUBBED INTO THE PUNCTURE MARKS & IF BLEEDING OCCURS ENSURE THAT THE INK IS STILL IN THE MARKS.

- If a tattoo is no longer readable another tattoo may be applied **after permission** is granted by the Branch Committee. Apply **in writing** to the Branch Secretary and arrangements will be made following Branch approval, for an inspector to re-tattoo in the goat's ear/s **along with** the society symbol.
- If an incorrect tattoo is inserted into a goat's ear, it **CANNOT** be changed under any circumstance.

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR JUDGES

Invitation:

Answer promptly. If costs are not offered let the organisers know exactly what is required (out of pocket expenses for petrol, cost of fares and accommodation, if needed). Accommodation can be a private home. Should a judge find that at the last minute he cannot officiate, inform the show organiser at once, suggest alternate names, or make sure they have a judges list. Ask to have a show schedule sent to the new judge. **Complete your invitation form and return promptly.**

Show Day:

Pre-judging. A judge's book, if used, should be made up the day before from the schedule. Dress should be neat, verging on the formal. Overall coats should be worn for buck classes.

At the Show:

Arrive on time. Make yourself known to the steward. If there are anomalies in the schedule, (which may occur in smaller country shows) discuss them before the show and sort them out. **DO NOT** let the steward tell you who has entered or show you the entry book or catalogue (both are likely to happen). Do not talk to competitors before judging if possible, sometimes it is unavoidable, if so, keep it to a minimum. (This should make no difference but is liable to miss-interpretation should the person to whom you were talking take out Best Exhibit etc.).

Judging:

Ask the steward if all the animals for each class are in the ring. Ask exhibitors to do whatever you require - walking around etc. Judge the animals on the day, regardless of previously known history of the owner. Line the animals up and place every animal. Should the class be large, prejudging may eventually have to be considered. A judge may ask a competitor the animals age, or whether a doe is running through, but **NOT** its place in the appendices or its breeding.

Sanitise hands between handling each udder in the udder class/es, especially if handling the teats, and at other necessary times. On **NO ACCOUNT** remove the teat plug when handling juniors, or express milk out of a milker. When confronted with a disqualifying fault, leave the animal at the bottom of the line, telling the handler quietly why you have done so, **NOT** everyone else, and send a letter to the relevant state committee informing them of its disqualification. After placing the ribbons, sum up.

Summing Up:

If desired, sum up after each class. Be **CONSTRUCTIVE & POLITE**. Refer to the faults as something to be improved, not as an excuse for shooting the animal. Exhibitors, no matter where placed, should leave the ring feeling they will show again. Persuade them to think positive, to think about how they can improve their animal, difficult as it may be in some cases. (Do not be led astray by exhibitors who ask you to tell them everything, they probably won't speak to you again if you do).

At the End Of The Day:

Thank the Show/Club committee for inviting you, sum up generally, again being constructive.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF EXHIBITORS

- ◆ Complete entry forms accurately.
- ◆ Wear a white non-identifying jacket & closed shoes in the ring.
- ◆ Stud names are not to be displayed in the judging arena where the judge may see them.
- ◆ Have their animals ready before the start of each class.
- ◆ Comply promptly with requests from the judge or the ring steward.
- ◆ Refrain from smoking, eating, chewing gum or chattering while in the ring.
- ◆ Take only exhibits to the show ring area or into the goat pavilion.
- ◆ Be physically capable of controlling their goats.
- ◆ On arrival, goat exhibitors should inform the steward of their arrival and any scratched or incorrect entries.
- ◆ Remain on the grounds until the conclusion of the show, and attend the presentation of the trophies, judge's comments etc.
- ◆ Ensure that their animals are properly restrained so that interference with other goats and their feed does not occur and that milk containers are securely covered.
- ◆ Be courteous in the show ring and out of it to create a good public image.
- ◆ Enjoy the Show.

ROLE OF THE SHOW STEWARDS

ALL stewards shall be neatly dressed; wear approved white dust-coats and closed shoes.

RING STEWARD.

- ◆ Inform the judge when all animals entered in the class are ready for judging.
- ◆ Instruct exhibitors when to parade, where to stand and in which order as the judge directs.
- ◆ Be unobtrusive, but within call of the judge at all times.
- ◆ Make decisions necessary as to condition of goats for exhibition, i.e., lice or other conditions.
- ◆ Decides if any tattoo is incorrect or illegible.
- ◆ Have ribbons and sashes ready when the judge has finished the placings.
- ◆ Have appropriate hand sanitisation equipment available.
- ◆ Records the placings and report same to book steward.

MARSHALLING STEWARD.

- ◆ Gives the exhibitors reminders of entries in impending classes. (1st call)
- ◆ Gives 2 more calls on the loud hailer (if one available) and the class will proceed.
- ◆ Ensures that the exhibitors are assembled at the ring entrance for each class.
- ◆ Assemble all contenders for Championships and other awards at the ring entrance at the appropriate time.

BOOK STEWARD.

- ◆ Is responsible for all book work on show day and may divide kid classes if required due to number of entries.
- ◆ Calculate points for all sashes and special awards.
- ◆ At the end of the show, gives marked and signed copies of the catalogue to the appropriate persons.
- ◆ Have all trophies set out ready for presentation at the conclusion of the show. (Trophies are to be on display during the show).
- ◆ Receives any protest from an exhibitor. A protest must be lodged in writing, accompanied by a \$2 (two) fee and lodged within 30 (thirty) minutes of the conclusion of the relevant class. Ring steward and Book Steward to deal with protest as soon as possible.

LIAISON OFFICER

The Branch Committee will appoint a liaison officer for shows with a dairy goat section on receipt of proposed liaison officer's name in writing.

Role of the Liaison Officers is to:

- Compile the **full** show results on the appropriate forms **IN BLACK INK**;
- Ensure all pages are signed on the day by the judge, chief steward and liaison officer and include all required blue card numbers, and herd book vol. numbers.
- Include name of Show, Date, Name of Judge, Name of Steward, Name of Liaison officer and their blue card number, **total** number of dairy goats (including bucks), Names of 1st, 2nd & 3rd placed goats & their owners for **all** classes [list all goats entered], the number of exhibits in each class, the results of all Championships including champion points awarded. To forward **all** original results of their show to the Secretary **within 21 days of the show** with a copy to the Dairy Doe convenors, retain a copy for themselves, and forward result page **directly** to Newsletter Editor.

QLD BRANCH, D.G.S.A. INC SHOW RULES

1. To attract Australian Championship points, the show must be conducted in accordance with Regulations 81 & 82 of the D.G.S.A. Regulations, Herd Book Vol 67.
2. Agricultural Societies have the right to accept or reject entries to shows held on their grounds and need not give reasons for so doing. Clubs **must** abide by this ruling.
3. All goats over 4 months of age must be registered, and those over 3 months, must have evidence of registration having been applied for with the D.G.S.A. Ltd. **All exhibitors must be DGSA members and registration papers can be asked for on the day.**
4. **All goats of any age must be clearly tattooed in accordance with NLIS regulations. This may change with new NLIS regulations.**
5. Goat's tattoos must be inspected on the day of showing.
6. The C.A.E Accreditation certificate must be for the property on which the goats are domiciled.
7. Age to be calculated to the day of showing, e.g., a goat turning one (1) year on show day is shown in 1 year and over class, **not** under 12 months. The only exception is the R.N.A.
8. All goats entered in progeny, type & production, best udder, & other specialty classes **must** be entered in their appropriate age class.
9. All does shown in milk **must** be milked out by the end of best udder classes, and all milk **MUST** be stored in a sealed container.
10. An entry fee is payable for each separate entry, not per goat entered.
NB. If you enter a show and do not attend, entry fees are still due & payable including any scratching/s.
11. The judge may or may not award places and championships as he/she chooses.
12. The steward has control over the running of the show on the day of showing.
13. Dairy Doe points will be forwarded for shows with a Branch Liaison Officer.

14. Type & Production classes.

How to work out the points.

Herd Recording: Type - Pointed out of 100 points.

Production - H.R figure - divide by 30 (e.g., 1840 divided by 30 = 61.33).

24 Hour Test: Type - Pointed out of 100 points.

Production - * or Q* figures (e.g., 23.6 Q* points).

Proof of production is to be submitted with entry.

15. **For Herd Recording class**, a Milk Awards Certificate signed by the Federal Milk Awards Officer **or** a copy of the interim certificate issued by the state Milk Awards Officer.

For 24 hr Test class, a Milk Award Certificate signed by the Federal Milk Awards officer, **or** a copy of the interim certificate issued by the state Milk Awards Officer.

16. **Champions & Reserves.** The first-place getter in each of the relevant age/breed classes is eligible for Champion. When a Champion has been selected, the goat that was placed second in the Champions age/breed class is eligible to enter the ring to compete for Reserve Champion. If no second place was awarded in the Champions age/breed class, the Reserve may be selected from the remaining first place getters. **Grand Champion** (or Supreme Champion) is selected from the Age Champions.

17. The class rating of any show may be upgraded or downgraded according to number of entries.

18. **Completing ENTRY FORMS.** Instructions are for the Standard Entry Form available from the Queensland Branch Web Site or the Branch Secretary.

- ⇒ Exhibitors can photocopy the entry form for their own reference.
- ⇒ Where registration has been applied for, show R A F in column for Herd Book Number.
- ⇒ When a goat is in more than one class, full details of exhibit need only be entered once.
- ⇒ Dam & Progeny classes - Enter Dam's name and progeny's name only.
- ⇒ Sire & Progeny classes - Enter Sire's name and progeny's name only.
- ⇒ Sire & Dam's Progeny classes - enter as Progeny of.....
- ⇒ All details must be supplied except for App D where sire and dam may be excluded.

- ⇒ All entries must be CLEARLY typed or printed.
- ⇒ Entry form to be certified that animals shown are registered with the DGSA. Ltd.

19. All exhibits at shows using Branch approved schedules are to be from C.A.E. Accredited herds.

A copy of a current CAE accreditation certificate or negative blood test taken no more than 30 days after the expiry date of the certificate will be accepted. In extenuating circumstances, the exhibitor can contact the committee and /or DPI. If this is not complied with entries will be rejected and goats may not be shown.

20. Most successful exhibitor points. Points are awarded the same as for Dairy Doe of the Year, but also include Type & Production and Progeny classes where exhibits are **owned by the exhibitor.**

N.B.: INAPPROPRIATE BEHAVIOR AT SHOWS WILL NOT BE TOLERATED.

TWO RING SHOW PROTOCOL

There are several rules that must be adhered to if you want the show to attract Australian Championship and Dairy Doe, Kid and Buck points. At present, with few Australian Melaans and Australian Browns being exhibited they are shown together, with the newer breeds, the same situation exists, therefore they are shown in Any Other Dairy Breed classes.

1. Use a Branch approved schedule and only one set of Liaison Papers.
2. The judge and steward for each ring are to complete Australian Championship cards for the breeds they had in their ring. The Grand Champion Doe/Buck record should be signed by the Chief Steward and both judges.
3. Aside from an overall Chief Steward, you need a set of Stewards for each ring, (ring, round up and pencil), but only one Liaison Person is needed.
4. Entries must close at least 7 days prior to the show and no late entries should be accepted. The reason for this is that many exhibitors show more than one breed. The order of classes in each ring may need to be adjusted to prevent any exhibitor being needed in both rings at the same time. This also avoids judges from having to stand around for several classes.
5. Best Udder and Type & Production classes may be divided between rings, i.e.: Ring 1. T&P Herd Recording, 1st Lactation all breeds. Ring 2. T&P 24 Hr. and 2nd & Subsequent Lactation all breeds. The winners of both udder classes come together in one ring and both judges make the decision jointly using their score cards from each of their classes to find the Best Udder of Show.
6. Breed Champions are judged by the judge in the ring in which their breed is shown. The Breed Champions come together in one ring where both judges complete a score card on those animals to choose the Grand Champion.
7. Both Junior and Kid Champions are judged in the one ring using score cards.
8. The Buck section is judged as for the does.
9. Supreme Exhibit is judged in the one ring by both judges using a score card.

SUGGESTED SET UP OF CLASSES FOR A TWO RING SHOW

Ring 1. For Saanens, Anglo Nubians, and Australian Melaans/Australian Browns.

Ring 2. For British Alpines, Toggenburgs and Any Other Dairy Goat Breeds.

As above, the two judges work together using score cards where necessary.

Once all entries have been received you may need to alter the order of classes to ensure an exhibitor is not needed in both rings at the same time. Class order is flexible to accommodate this and is the reason entries must close early. You may also find very few entries in one or two breeds; this may mean you use Ring 1. For Saanens and Anglo Nubians and Ring 2. for all the other breeds, this too is flexible and decided when you sort entries.

REGARDING SHOW SCHEDULES.

Agricultural Show Societies had adopted one of the 3 standard show schedules published in the Branch Book. It is now up to **YOU**, as steward, to ensure they have a copy of the new schedules with the classes for all six breeds and an Any Other Dairy Breed as printed in the 2019 Herd Book. Altered or extended schedules may be used.

NOTE * Non-Accredited Shows – Do not collect Dairy Doe Points.**

The Branch Show uses Schedule 1, should this change it will be published in the Newsletter. Show schedules are published in the Branch Book as being Schedule **1, 2A or 2B, Kid and Goatling and Buck Shows**. Intending exhibitors should refer to one of the following schedules to determine which classes they should enter.

Agricultural Show Societies & Clubs may exclude or include classes from a standard schedule, however championships cannot be altered.

These inclusions or exclusions will be noted in the promotional material for the show.

Please note: Class numbers remain constant even if classes are deleted or included e.g., class 50, "a, b, c"

& added class 50, "a, b, c, d". Age classes can be divided at the discretion of the judge and steward depending on the number of entries received.

ENTRY FORMS

All forms are available on the branch website <http://www/dairygoatsqld.org.au> , or contact your Branch Secretary.

Brisbane R.N.A. & Toowoomba R.A.S., both have their own schedules and entry forms. Apply directly to the show societies for these. **NB: Both Toowoomba and the R.N.A. entries close EARLY.** Please contact the show society directly for closing dates.

CAE/CRV ACCREDITATION SHOW REQUIREMENTS, QLD

A copy of a current CAE accreditation certificate or negative blood test taken no more than 30 days after the expiry date of the certificate will be accepted. In extenuating circumstances, the exhibitor can contact the committee, or a Biosecurity result verification of a whole herd test can be submitted.

If this is not complied with entries will be rejected and goats may not be shown.

If this is not done you will not be able to show your dairy goats until a new certificate is issued.

We would advise that the description of the goats on your property be kept simple e.g., Dairy Goats instead of listing all breeds. You can show any Dairy Breed even if your certificate only lists one Dairy Breed.

If moving your stock to another property, the accreditation expires. Therefore, a new certificate is required for the new property after inspection by the Veterinary Officer.

NATIONAL JOHNE'S PROGRAM

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR SHOW COMPETITORS AND SHOW ORGANISERS/STEWARDS

There is a new requirement for biosecurity declarations for those attending shows (or sales or exhibitions) as well as those who organise the show (show society, goat club etc.). Show Stewards need to collect these declarations in the same way Waybills have previously been collected.

These forms give competitors a better level of confidence that the biosecurity risk at a show venue is being minimised and managed.

FAQ's:

I am competing at the show – what forms do I need?

- Complete the revised *Goat Herd Health Status Declaration for Shows & Sales* form. This form covers Johnes, CAE (and footrot declaration for shows in Western Australia).

- The above form to be accompanied by the National Goat Health Statement/Waybill that declares the herd assurance rating (we are all familiar with this one).

I am organising the show – what do I need to do?

- Show organisers need to have the grounds/facility audited to ensure the biosecurity requirements for the Johnes MAP program are being met (particularly important for any competitors who are on the GoatMAP scheme).

- The form is *GoatMAP Show, Sale & Exhibition Venue Audit Form & Certificate of Compliance*. This form declares what minimum Johnes control status has been

designated for the show and then audits the facility to assess the risks and declare what measures and precautions are being taken to minimise risk for competitors.

- The Certificate of Compliance should be displayed in a prominent position for all to view.

Show Ring Dispute Resolution Protocol

Queensland members participate in two different types of dairy goat shows. These are Branch Shows and Agricultural Shows. Both are “staffed” by volunteers who freely and willingly give up their time to make the day run as smoothly as possible. Those competitions held at Agricultural Shows are under the auspice of that particular show society who are willing to work with the DGSA to have a dairy goat section. The site and amenities such as shelters, pens and bedding are at the discretion of that show society. The DGSA recognises the results of these shows when the liaison forms are completed correctly and forwarded to the Branch Secretary in the prescribed time frame. On occasion, an issue may arise which requires a resolution. Please follow the instructions below to address the situation.

Branch Shows:

1. Approach the Chief Steward and respectfully state your case. ***The chief steward should work towards an amiable solution which may involve a compromise by both parties.***
2. If the matter is not resolved a letter stating your complaint should be forwarded to the Branch Secretary to be tabled at the next Management Committee meeting
3. Should a resolution not be achieved then, a written complaint could be forwarded to the Federal Secretary

Agricultural Shows:

1. Approach the steward and respectfully state your concerns. ***The steward should work towards an amiable solution which may involve a compromise by both parties.***
2. Should you not reach an amiable resolution then the next step is to approach the Show Secretary.

As these shows are not conducted by the DGSA we have no jurisdiction on the showgrounds. If the complaint is regarding a Branch Member behaving inappropriately, a formal letter of complaint, should be forwarded to the Branch Secretary, who will table the complaint at the next Management Committee meeting.

NOTE: there is a child and young persons’ protection protocol on the Branch website, and it outlines the process to follow should any child or young person be in an unwanted situation or being treated inappropriately or is being abused.

REMEMBER that when attending shows, the public are watching, and you are an ambassador for the DGSA, so you should always, behave in a manner which will not discredit the society with the spectators.

Weight Chart

There are occasions when it is necessary to know how much your dairy goat weighs:
For example, when drenching it for worms, when calculating how much antibiotic injection it needs,

or when deciding if it is suitably grown for mating.

A Kid can be weighed on bathroom scales, but adult goats are too large for this & large animal scales

are expensive. Alternatively, weight can be calculated using the measurement of the heart girth in conjunction with the table below. The table has been adapted from one compiled by the Purina Goat Food Company (USA)
